COURSE INFORMATION

What is the aim of the module?

To provide an understanding of the general principles of international arbitration and a comparison of the main alternative dispute resolution processes – arbitration, mediation and adjudication. The course will give candidates a basic understanding of the principles of good practice and procedure in international arbitration.

What is covered within the syllabus?

- Comparison of Dispute Resolution Procedures
- Essential features, laws and rules: The UNCITRAL Model Law
- Composition, Powers and Jurisdiction of the arbitral tribunal
- Statement of Claim and Defence
- Organising the Proceedings
- Costs and Interest
- Hearings
- Arbitral Awards, drafting and enforcement
- Exercise in drafting an arbitration clause

How is the course delivered?

The course is delivered over 1 day on Saturday, November 3rd, 2012. The day starts at 9.00 am and runs to 5.00pm. After the course is completed there will be a networking event with senior members and leaders of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, followed by a sit-down dinner.

How will I be assessed?

Assessment consists of one assignment that is distributed to candidates on the day of the course. Candidates will be given 28 days to complete and submit the assignment. The result is a pass or fail based on understanding and knowledge of the material covered in the syllabus. Results are dispatched to candidates normally eight to twelve weeks from the date of the conclusion of the assignment.

What are the entry requirements?

There are no entry requirements. The course is intended for lawyer and non-lawyer candidates who:

- are new to the field of international arbitration;
- wish to learn more about international arbitration and its benefits to users; and
- wish to become accredited as an Associate member of CIArb.

What does the course fee include?

The course fee includes registration on the course, the first attempt at the assignment, study materials, lunch and refreshments throughout the day, networking event and sit down dinner. Candidates are advised to refer to the registration and contact form which details other fees that may be relevant.

What happens when I register for the course?

Upon successful registration, candidates will receive confirmation they are booked on the course. Joining instructions and course materials will be sent to candidates approximately 2 weeks before the course start date.

What is my next step when I complete the course?

On successful completion of this course, candidates:

- may attend the networking event and sit-down dinner on Saturday evening November 3rd;
- will be awarded an Introductory Certificate; and
- will be eligible to apply for Associate grade of CIArb, and take advantage of a range of educational and professional benefits.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the format of this training?

Primarily the sessions will be discussion led by faculty members vetted by the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. Before the training a series of written questions will be posed which are designed to help focus each Candidate's review and will be used as a basis for discussion. Following the training will be a written exercise which will be marked (graded). A workbook will be provided.

What grade of membership will I be entitled to?

If you successfully complete the programme and written exercise, you will be entitled to apply for Associate membership.

What is the significance of attaining accreditation as an Associate member of the CI Arb?

Associate members of the CI Arb may use the post-nominal letters/designation "ACI Arb" which reflects a professional commitment to the encouragement and promotion of private dispute resolution.
